9	Invocation by Councilperson Hendershot.
10	
11	City Clerk Hewitt called the roll and the following councilpersons were in attendance: Vice
12	Mayor DeWitt, D. Haynes, P. Haynes, Hendershot, Simms, Wood and Mayor Saunders. Also
13	present: City Manager Deanna J. Hess, Fire Chief Clarke, Police Chief Mitchell, Street Foreman
14	Wallace, CPA Kathryn Goddard, Attorney Thomas White, and City Clerk Hewitt.

17	Regular Counch Meeting of June 21, 2016.
18	Councilperson P. Haynes moved to accept and approve the minutes of the regular council
19	meeting of June 21, 2016, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt.
20	mooning of ourse 21, 2010, seconded by Countemperson 20 William
21	Councilperson Wood made a correction on page 1, lines 28 & 29, should read, "\$2,500 for the
22	first two years, \$2,500 for the third and fourth year. A total increase of \$5,000."
23	
24	Vice Mayor DeWitt made a motion to approve the minutes as amended, seconded by
25	Councilperson Simms. Motion carried unanimously.

27	GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:
28	
29	* Jane Klug, 2015 Jackson Street and Chairperson for Friends of Parks & Recreation, said the
30	group is concerned about the pool. Council needs to ask the citizens what they want and look at
31 32	different options. She said that rumors are going around that Mayor Saunders wants to look at
33	options to build a new pool.
34	Mayor Saunders said the comment was his opinion only, not councils.
35	major basineers said the comment was insorption only, not councils.
36	* Darren Wise, 217 Cedar Avenue, said he was opposed to the spot zoning request at 1513 Third
37	Street, former Berry's Market. Saying that neighbors do not want a retail business in a

residential neighborhood. And one neighbor did not like the fence leaning against her fence.

- * Aaron McElfresh, 1518 Third Street, said he was also opposed to the zone change. He does not want the neighborhood filled with businesses.
- * Jim Wade, owner of 1513 Third Street, said he does not want to upset his neighbors and after speaking to one individuals, she was happy the ice cream shop was moving in. He also said if the neighbors want the fence removed, he will remove it. The fence was there when he purchased the property.
- * Carl Boso, 305 10th Street, said he agrees with Mayor Saunders on building a new pool. And asked Chief Mitchell if his officers have addressed the list of vehicles he turned in two weeks ago.
- Chief Mitchell said his officers have not addressed them yet, but they will.
- Councilperson Wood reminded Mr. Boso that council gave him 2 more months to rent his property on Fostoria Avenue but he has done nothing to renovate the house on Parriott Avenue. Mr. Boso said he had someone that was going to tear the property down for him.

- Councilperson Wood then asked Attorney White, if someone would have 3 cockatiels in their house, does that count as 3 of the 6 birds they are permitted to have. Mr. White said his interpretation of the code would be any bird, inside or outside.
